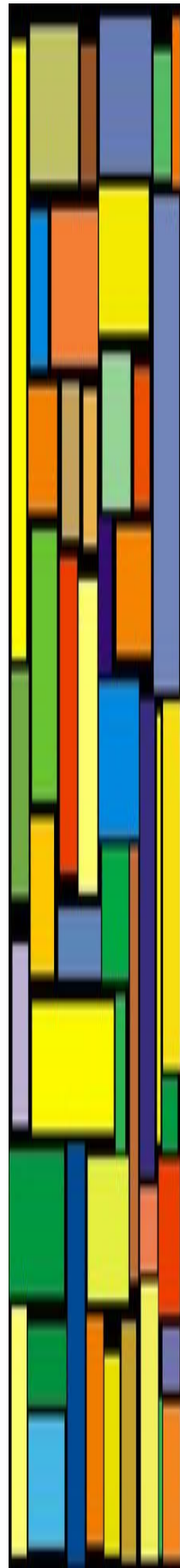

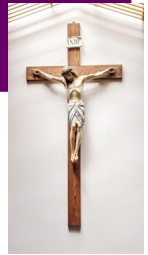

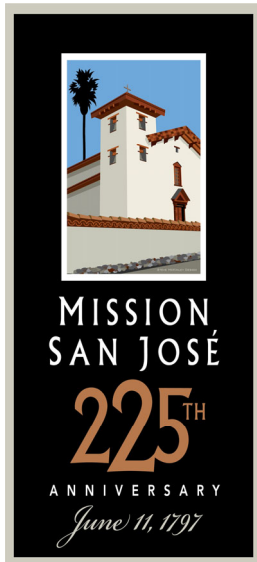

GOOD NEWS



**THIS IS THE DAY WHICH THE LORD HAS MADE;
LET US REJOICE AND BE GLAD IN IT! (Ps 118:24)**

Reflection by Sister Marcia Krause, O.P.

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! All three readings today focus on Jesus' Resurrection from the dead and its meaning for our lives. In the first reading from Acts, Peter states that all who come to believe in the Risen Christ will have their sins forgiven. In both of the alternative second readings, Paul stresses the moral dimension of the Resurrection. And in the Gospel, Peter and John go on an 'Easter trip' to the tomb. Even though Peter gets there first, John is the first to believe that Christ is risen.

Resurrection is not a theological fact we proclaim with our lips and then forget as life's business continues. Resurrection is all about God eating and being with us, God being really real in our everyday experiences. In God "we live and move and have our being." (Acts 17:28) We need only to "set (our) minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for (we) have died, and (our) life is hidden with Christ in God" (Col. 3:2-3).

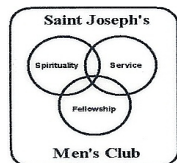
As we proclaim glorious alleluias and trumpet shouts of praise, resurrection continues to be a wondrous mystery in our lives, to be discovered over and over again, experienced while not being understandable. Like Mary Magdalene, we stumble in the dark into the reality of Jesus' Resurrection. Our journey in life is to live and believe that as we journey to the tomb, we glimpse moments of resurrection. When we remove stones that block forgiveness, empathy, and love, we are moving toward an empty grave where Christ is not to be found. Instead, we confront faith's mystery. Jesus is risen! Jesus has been removed from the tomb of death. He is risen, alleluia! Christ must be free and alive and available to all who call upon Him. He is also present to those who but only stand and peer in but don't enter the tomb. Hopefully, we can risk entering the empty tomb and discover that Christ's presence has not been taken away but is now everywhere. And so in faith, we see new life unveiled before our eyes. We might have conflicting emotions as did the first witnesses, yet we need to also witness to this truth of Jesus' Resurrection. It needs to empower our life, fuel our faith, and give reason to our very being. May we find ways daily to witness to the resurrection by our life, in our family, and in the life of our parish.

Jesus, risen Christ, on this alleluia day let me praise you in glorious song. You have redeemed us by your passion, death, and resurrection and brought us to new life, hidden with God in you. May the joy of the resurrection fill my heart, so that I may share the good news with everyone in my life: He is risen indeed, Alleluia! Amen

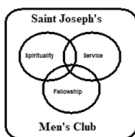

All proceeds will go to support the various parish ministries, programs, and projects of the St. Joseph Men's Club.

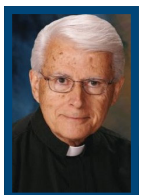

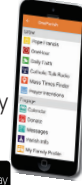
