The "Joseph Faria Memorial Scholarship" to Dylan Dsilva



José Jesus Vallejo, First Administrator of Mission San José

The next presentation in our Speaker Series at 9:30am on July 9, 2022 will be "José de Jesus Vallejo, First Administrator of Mission San José" given by descendant, Martha Vallejo McGettigan. Once Mexico won its independence from Spain, Mexico removed the padres from administration of the Missions. This post-Mission era was a time of significant change for Mission San José. Mission lands were divided into land grants, and prominent families received these grants to form ranchos. Come learn how once prosperous Mission San José and the Native Californians who lived here were impacted. Though sometimes overshadowed by his younger brother, compared to his father, and sometimes misquoted and misidentified by his daughter, José de Jesus made his mark in the annals of history and with distinction. Shepherds Field Olive Wood Handcrafts

A group from the Holy Land (Bethlehem & Jerusalem) will be selling religious articles after masses to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. As a tradition, many of the Catholic families in the Holy Land work in small workshops to produce religious articles from olive wood. These articles represent the Christian art of the Holy Land. In the past, they used to sell their artwork to pilgrims who visit the Holy Land. *However, these days they are facing an economic hardship, as there are no tourists at all visiting the Holy Land due to pandemic. Many of the Catholic families have immigrated and left the Holy Land.* The percentage of Christians in the Holy Land has dropped from 20% to less than 1%. Therefore, if this hardship continues as it is now, we believe that in a few years, there will be no Catholics in Bethlehem or Jerusalem. The struggle to preserve the Catholic identity of the birthplace of our savior; Jesus Christ is a serious concern for Catholics around the world. Sales will be used to help and support the Catholics in the Holy Land and to encourage them not to immigrate.


