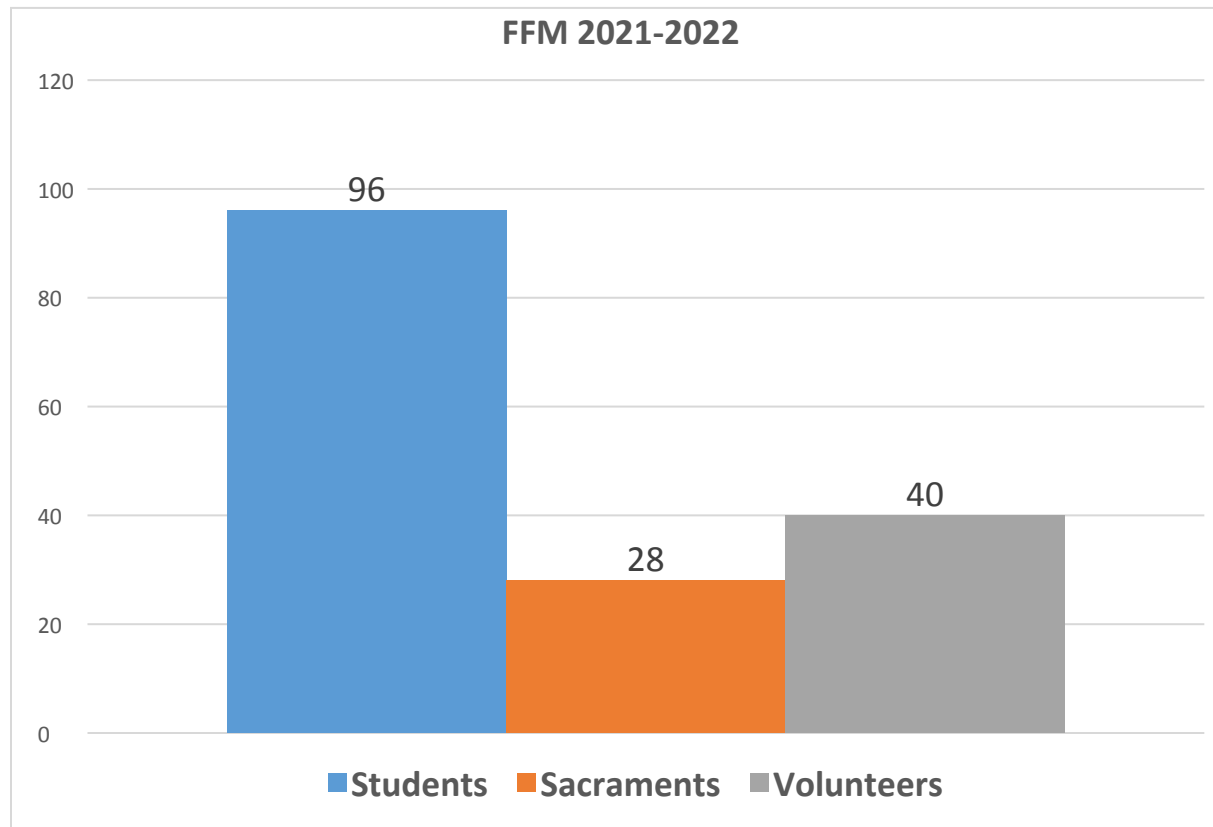


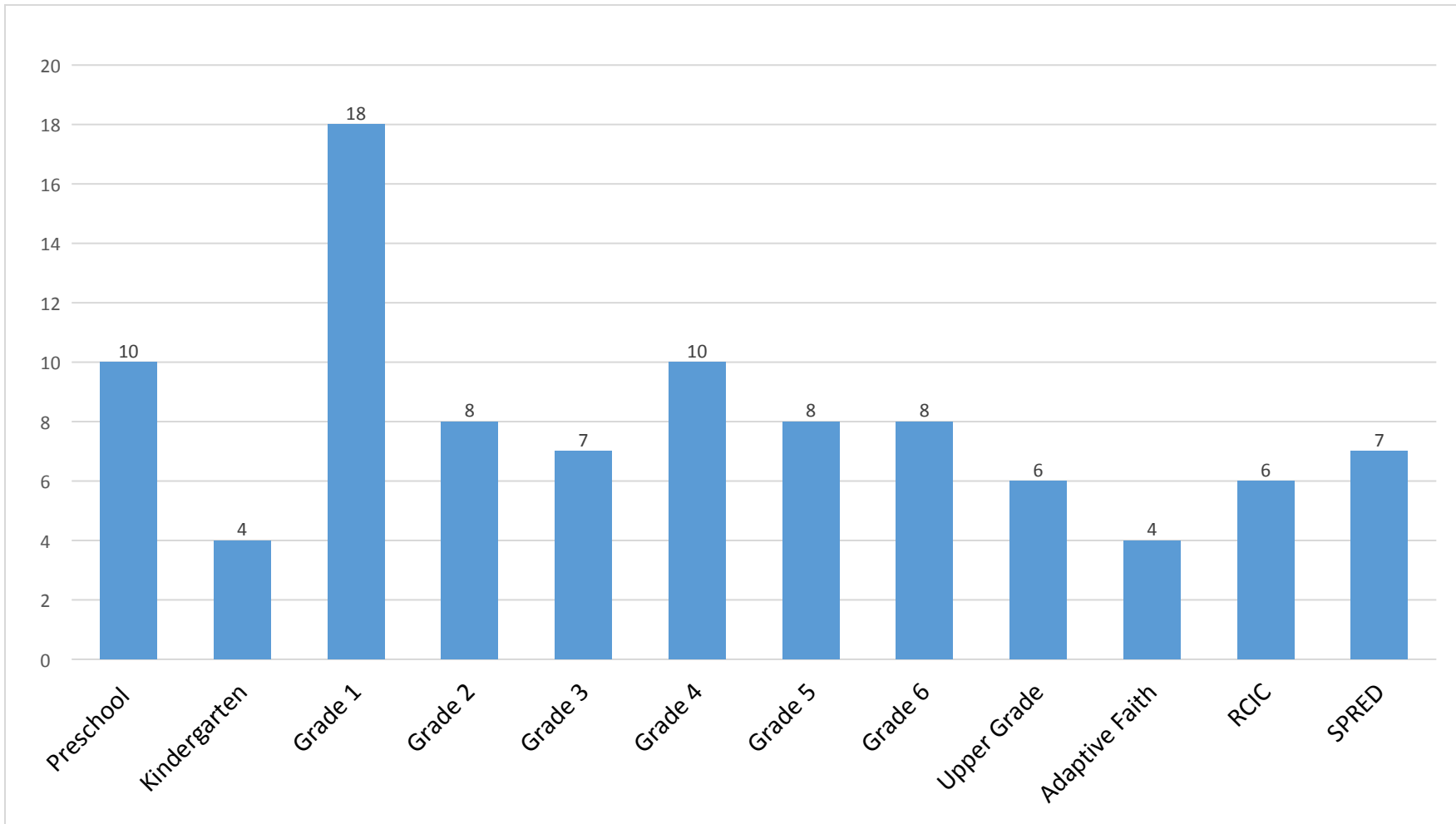
Family of Faith Ministry Report

2021-2022

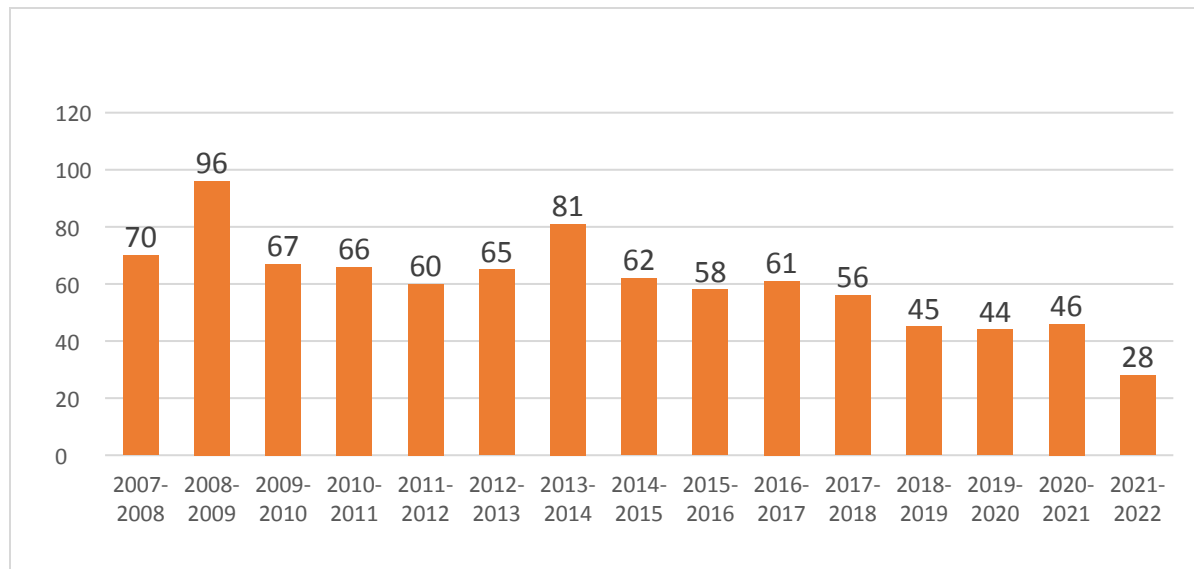
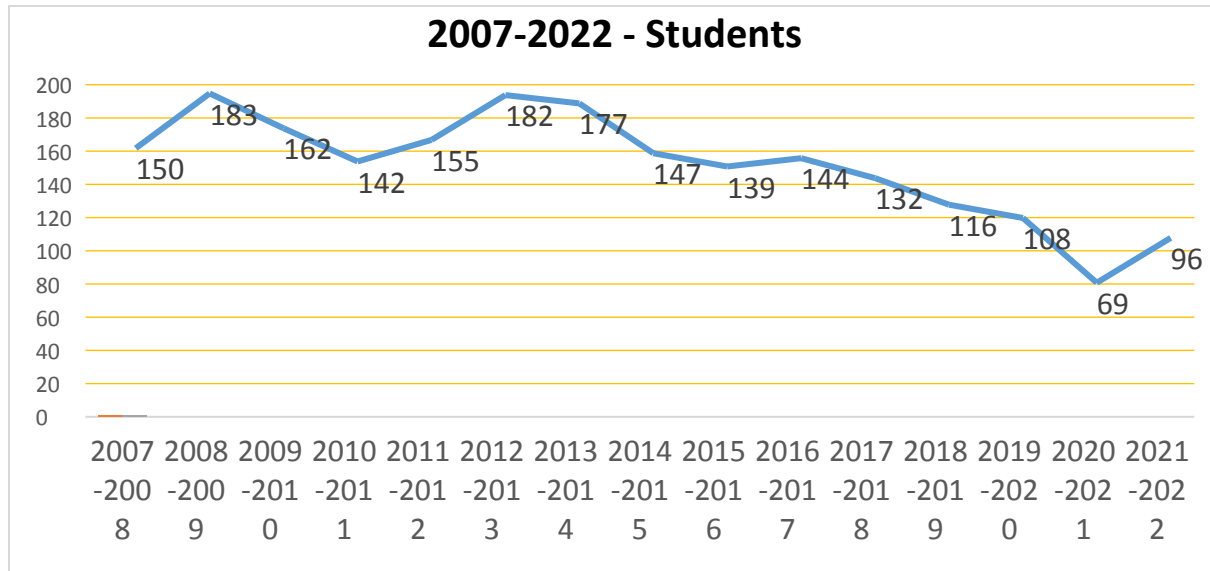
This report shows a compilation of the first year of Family of Faith Ministry for 2021-2022. The data were secured to show the following:

- 3) Catechists/volunteers

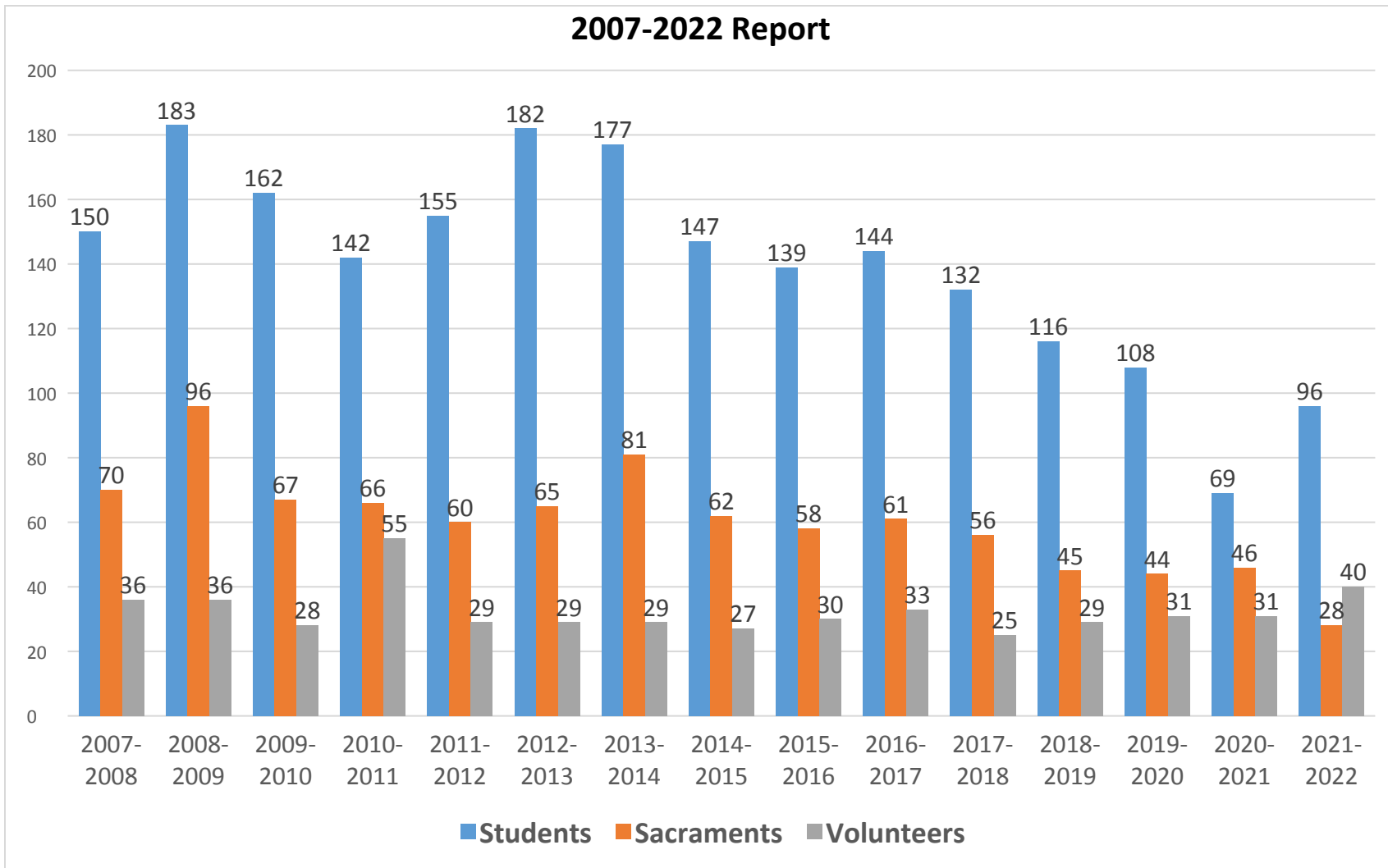




This graph shows the number of students per grade. We are hopeful that these numbers will increase as the church community becomes more familiar with the program and what it offers. For the Adaptive Faith, RCIC and SPRED, the numbers remain the same. The same special friends and their families continue to attend and learn the lessons prepared weekly by the Adaptive Faith Formation Team. These amazing families, catechists and volunteers are so involved and committed to support our Special Friends.



These 2 charts show the full report of the 15 year-history of the Faith Formation Program which evolved to The Family of Faith Ministry last year. The Faith Formation program started declining steadily in 2014. Then we suffered the effects of the Pandemic in 2020. With the introduction of the new Family of Faith Ministry, we can see an increase for 2021.



Conclusion: This chart shows the span of 15-years. As a comparison from 2020-2021, we started to see a decent increase of students enrolled in Family of Faith Ministry for the first year after Covid. In 2021, 69 students attended Faith Formation classes via zoom and by 2022, it increased to 96 students in Family of Faith Ministry and classes were held onsite.

This year, we have four students in our Adaptive Faith Formation (Children with Special Needs) and two received their sacraments, one for First Communion and the other one for Confirmation. We have seven friends in our SPRED Program (Special Religious Education – for adults). There is also a slight increase in volunteers from a year ago.
