





Prayer to Saint Michael





Sunday, Jul 31, 2022—Dizzy yet?

Do you ever feel like the world is spinning out of control? You're not alone: Pope Francis has called this effect of modern culture "rapidification." It's not just you: Things really are happening, progressing, and becoming obsolete faster—including what many of us do for a living. We're not unlike the tragic lamplighter in Catholic author Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's classic, The Little Prince. The lamplighter's planet is turning faster, but he still operates at the same mortal speed. He must now respond to 1,440 sunsets where there used to be just one. Now more than ever, we need to honor our Sabbaths and take our rest.

Monday, Aug 01, 2022—Vocation is deeper than a job

Alphonsus Liguori is the patron saint of many things, including the

work of laypeople. Even though he was a founder of a religious order, the Redemptorists, he was, of course, first a layperson himself—and one with a successful career. A lawyer who didn't lose a case for eight years straight, he still found time in his busy schedule to visit the terminally ill, which is how he discovered his true vocation and became a priest and leading theologian. Liguori might be the first to advise: Take a break from work to give back to the community and you might get your big break in finding your mission.

Peter Julian Eymard, the French Catholic priest who founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, had a deep love and understanding of the Eucharist. "How kind is our Sacramental Jesus! He welcomes you at any hour of the day or night. His Love never knows rest," he said. "When you visit Him, He forgets your sins and speaks only of His joy, His tenderness, and His Love. By the reception He gives to you, one would think He has need of you to make Him happy." Take such words to heart as we begin the U.S. bishops' new Eucharistic Revival.

Wednesday, Aug 03, 2022—Let your life be one of service

Sor Isolina Ferré Aguayo, M.S.B.T., a Missionary Sister, died on this day in 2000 after a lifetime of service to the poor of her Native Puerto Rico and New York. Known as the "Mother Teresa of Puerto Rico," Aguayo served people living on the margins and opened schools and resource centers throughout Puerto Rico and beyond. For her tireless work, she received 17 honorary degrees and more than 50 additional awards including the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1999, bestowed for "her passionate fight against poverty, violence, and despair in Puerto Rico and Brooklyn, New York, where she worked to reconcile rival gangs in 1950-1960." In endowing the award, President Clinton said Sor Isolina taught people "to see the best in themselves and in their communities." May we all serve so well. TODAY'S READINGS: Jeremiah 31:1-7; Matthew 15:21-28 (409). "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish."

Thursday, Aug 04, 2022—Persistence is a virtue

Sometimes a vocation comes packaged with obstacles. Perhaps it is God's way of testing our resolve. In any

case, John Vianney, born in revolutionary France in 1786, modeled persistence in his

determination to become a priest. His religious training was disrupted by the anticlerical reign of terror unleashed during the French Revolution. Priests in hiding who risked their lives to administer the sacraments became Vianney's heroes,



and once the church was reestablished, Vianney entered seminary. Today we know him as the patron saint of parish priests. May his story inspire us to overcome obstacles that keep us from our God-given vocation, whatever that might be.

At home in a house church

Christians first gathered in homes, or "house churches," before there were dedicated religious buildings. Remember the "upper room" where the disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit? It was likely one of the first house churches. As Christians were able to more freely express their faith, churches were built. One of the most historic and significant churches is the Basilica of Mary Major in Rome. It was built out of deep love of Mary and her significance in salvation history. It holds many important relics, works of art, and the sacred experiences of pilgrims since the fifth century. What is a church that has been especially meaningful for you?

Bury the bomb

On August 6, 1945 at 8:15 in the morning, an atomic bomb exploded above Hiroshima, Japan, dropped from an American B-29 bomber. In an instant some 70,000 souls were incinerated by the 10,000-degree fireball generated in the blast. By the end of the year, injury and radiation doubled the total number of deaths. Seventy-five years later, Pope Francis declared the use of atomic weapons, even the mere possession of such devices, to be immoral. Reflect on the transfigured Christ who stands in solidarity with the suffering and dead of all crimes against humanity.

REFLECTION



Gospel Reflection- Sunday, July 31, 2022 - Luke 12:13-21, By Gina Mehta, Parish Business Manager We can draw a parallel in the Rich man's bountiful harvest and our desire to work hard, become successful and accumulate wealth to enjoy earthly things. There is nothing wrong in becoming successful, but when we put wealth and material things before God, we slowly forget that true wealth is by investing our mind and soul in relationship with God and helping others in need. This is first and foremost.

In today's parable, one could easily argue that the rich man is a wise and responsible person. He has a thriving farming business. There is one very important thing the rich man has not planned for, his relationship with God. The rich man is only thinking of himself. The rich man has no sense of gratitude to God or to the workers who had helped him plant and harvest his crops. He is blind to the fact that his life is not his own to secure, that his life belongs to God, and that God can demand it back at any time.

Like the rich farmer, we are tempted to think that having large amounts of money and possessions saved up will make us secure. Sooner or later, however, we learn that no amount of wealth or property can secure our lives. No amount of wealth can protect us from sickness or from a tragic accident. No amount of wealth can keep our relationships healthy and our families from falling apart. In fact, wealth and property can easily put stress between family members, as in the case of the brothers fighting over their inheritance at the beginning of today's reading.

Most importantly, no amount of wealth can secure our lives with God. In fact, Jesus repeatedly warns that wealth can get in the way of our relationship with God. In today's reading: "Take care!" he says. "Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions".

REFUGEE TEAM

Meet the newest families

The Refugee Team has been extremely busy serving 3 Afghan families since June 30. Fardeen and his wife have 4 children - 1.5, 10 and 6 year old girls, and an 8 year old boy; Naqibullah and his wife have a 3 year old child; and Abdul and his wife (who is expecting a baby) have a young boy. We have been able to provide beds, sheets, blankets and comforters, kitchen dishes, utensils, pots and pans, sofas, dressers, tables and chairs, TV stands, bath towels, irons and ironing boards and other essentials needed to start a home to all these families.

And the shed is sorely depleted.

It needs basics: Twin & Queen sized sheets, blankets and comforters, pillows, dishes, pots & pans, cups, mugs and glasses, knife sets and bath towel sets. Additionally, when we can get them, we try to supply table and standing lamps, dining table & chairs, dressers, nightstands, Iron & Ironing boards, laundry baskets and kitchen trash bins.

Your donations support families who need help - these are the things that matter to God.
