

V. The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence (continued)

The presence of Christ by the power of his word and the Holy Spirit (continued)

1376 The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."

1377 The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ.

1378 Worship of the Eucharist. In the liturgy of the Mass we express our faith in the real presence of Christ under the species of bread and wine by, among other ways, genuflecting or bowing deeply as a sign of adoration of the Lord. "The Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult of adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession."

1379 The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species. It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

Third Sunday of Easter... A Reflection by Dick Bayless

Where do you get answers to your most important questions in life? Certainly not from Google...or your favorite Social Media website.

We are on a journey that we hope leads to everlasting life with Jesus, Mother Mary, and the Saints.

There are many twists and turns on this journey, where there are many opportunities to take a wrong turn and loose Hope. Our wonderful God loves us beyond all knowledge, and has provided gifts, which can enable us to achieve our goal, if we are persistent in seeking them out, and applying them with the best of our efforts.

In our Gospel scenario for today Clopas and the other disciple traveling to Emmaus have suffered a loss of Hope and a gain in Uncertainty that their teacher Jesus was indeed the long-awaited Messiah. Then they invited an unknown traveler to join them on their journey. Maybe He could help them provide the missing pieces to the puzzle "Who is Jesus for us, in our lives? 


Here, a million wounded souls are yearning just to touch You and be healed; Gather all your people, and hold them to your heart.

Refugee Committee Update:

The friends of one of "our" Afghanistan families from several years ago, recently were in need of some help. The Abul Raof. A U.S. Army translator in Afghanistan and his family (wife and 5 children) were living in Pittsburg where the Abdul worked in a convenience store. He was killed at work on March 23, 2023.

His wife was afraid to stay by themselves in Pittsburg, so they moved in with "our" past family. The Pittsburg community secured an apartment for her in San Leandro and is assisting with rent, food, and other

support. Thanks to the continuing support of our parishioners, we were able to cover the costs of moving the family to their new home in San Leandro.

Two other families have arrived recently reuniting with their relatives who have been here 5 years, gone back to school to learn a new trade, gotten a job, have children attending school and recently they received US citizenship! While IRC and the Jewish Services help them come in, we are able to also serve some of their needs in setting up a household, thanks to your generosity. I can not help but remember Matthew 6:21 -"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Thank you.

Table manners

Someone once said we like our heroes dead more than alive. Cesar Chavez co-founded the United Farm Workers movement but found himself denounced as a communist and surveilled by the FBI during his lifetime. Only after death was his stature recognized, and he was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Encouraged by a priest who fueled him with Catholic social teaching, Chavez was also inspired by the nonviolent resistance of Gandhi. Along with lifelong co-worker Dolores Huerta, Chavez brought national attention to an abused yet fundamental part of our work force. Support farm workers' rights and remember at every table

Mark left his mark

Mark wasn't a direct disciple of Jesus but was quite active in the Early Church. He was closest to Peter, the latter returning to Mark's mother's house after escaping prison. According to Saint Jerome: "Mark, the disciple and interpreter of Peter, wrote a short gospel at the request of the brethren at Rome embodying what he had heard Peter tell. When Peter had heard this, he approved it and published it to the churches to be read by his authority." Mark's short, action-packed gospel highlights the immediacy of Jesus' actions; Mark also uses the word eutheos— Greek for "right away"—more than 40 times. *How might the Spirit*

be tapping you to act with immediacy?

The real deal

Today's gospel has a eucharistic theme, with talk of "living bread" and "flesh for the life of the world." One way the church emphasizes the Eucharist is its insistence on the Real Presence, that is, the core belief that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. They are not just symbols but, as Saint John Damascene wrote, the "actual deified body of the Lord." If wrestling with that concept makes your head hurt, know that the church also acknowledges this is a "mystery" -- something the mind cannot fully grasp. Leave it to the heart to understand.


