Catechism of the Catholic Church

VI. The Paschal Banquet

The Fruits of Holy Communion (continued)

1398 The Eucharist and the unity of Christians. Before the greatness of this mystery St. Augustine exclaims, "O sacrament of devotion! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!" The more painful the experience of the divisions in the Church which break the common participation in the table of the Lord, the more urgent are our prayers to the Lord that the time of complete unity among all who believe in him may return.

1399 The Eastern churches that are not in full communion with the Catholic Church celebrate the Eucharist with great love. "These Churches, although separated from us, yet possess true sacraments, above all - by apostolic succession - the priesthood and the Eucharist, whereby they are still joined to us in closest intimacy." A certain communion in sacris, and so in the Eucharist, "given

suitable circumstances and the approval of Church authority, is not merely possible but is encouraged."

1400 Ecclesial communities derived from the Reformation and separated from the Catholic Church, "have not preserved the proper reality of the Eucharistic mystery in its fullness, especially because of the absence of the sacrament of Holy Orders." It is for this reason that Eucharistic intercommunion with these communities is not possible for the Catholic Church. However these ecclesial communities, "when they commemorate the Lord's death and resurrection in the Holy Supper . . . profess that it signifies life in communion with Christ and await his coming in glory."

1401 When, in the Ordinary's judgment, a grave necessity arises, Catholic ministers may give the sacraments of Eucharist, Penance, and Anointing of the Sick to other Christians not in full communion with the Catholic Church, who ask for them of their own will, provided they give evidence of holding the Catholic faith regarding these sacraments and possess the required dispositions.

Reflection



June 11, 2023 - John 6:51-58

Rowena Radich, Director, Family of Faith, Marriage, Evangelization

In honor of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, I reflect on my service as a Eucharistic minister. During the distribution of the most precious Body of Christ, a line of the Faithful approach me. I say, "The Body of Christ." With an affirming "Amen", I place the Eucharist in their open hands to receive Jesus and I'm moved by their various states—youthful, elderly, chubby, pale, dark, soft, calloused, smooth, wrinkled, scarred, cracked, and sometimes even a little dirty. The condition of these beautiful hands is a reminder that Jesus freely gave His life for the salvation of EVERYONE that we might have eternal life with Him. He gives the complete gift of Himself to us, in the most intimate way, the Holy

Eucharist. As Catholics, we believe Christ is present in the Eucharist, not symbolically, but in a real and substantial way. We are His beloved and He calls us to be in communion with Him and His Church. How are we transformed by the graces of the Eucharist's great mystery? Lord Jesus Christ, You are the bread of life! May we always hunger for You and be satisfied in You alone. Help us to adore You and to love one another. Fill us with Your passion and zeal for the kingdom of God and, with You as our strength, to serve those in need without expecting any return. Allow us always to rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, and persevere in prayer. Amen. Congratulations to our First Holy Communicants!
