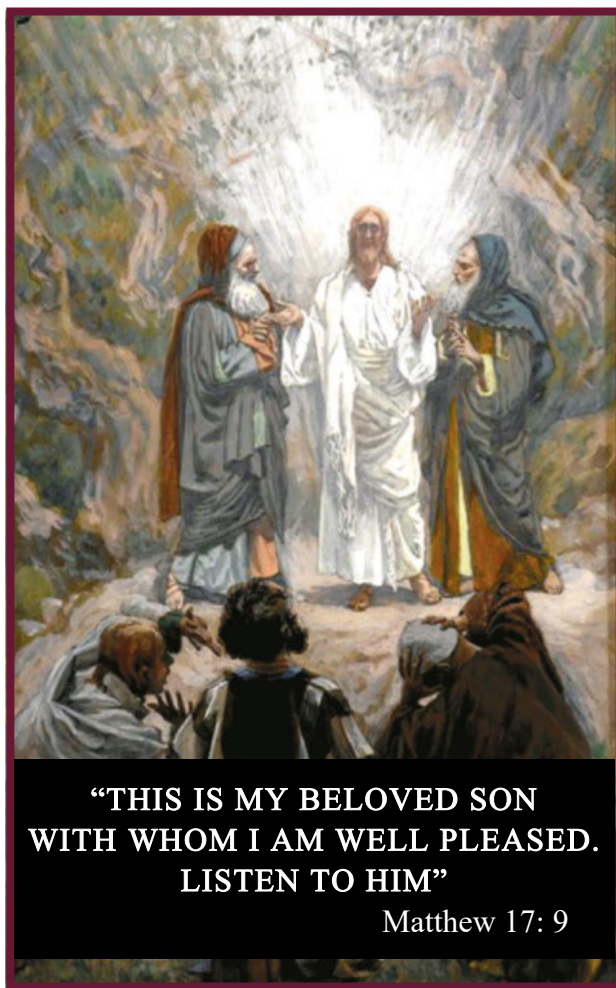

### Transfiguration of the Lord

Matthew 17:1-9

Reflection by Grace Lichauco

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus takes His chosen disciples, Peter, James, and John up the mountain. This was nothing unusual for them to do; but this time, when Jesus was transfigured before their eyes, the disciples were caught off guard. It was a sight that they will never forget. Jesus' face shined and His clothes were white as light! Jesus spoke differently; reminding them of His divinity, of His strength, of the rejections, sufferings, and His death that awaits Him. The disciples could not believe what they heard and in disbelief told Jesus that this is not going to happen. Suddenly, a voice from the cloud said: *"This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to Him."* The disciples were fearful but Jesus touched each one of

them, saying; "Rise, and do not be afraid." As divine as He was, Jesus was also human and He wanted His disciples to be strong and prepared when their faith is entirely tested during His crucifixion and death.

Transfiguration happens to us as well. As we go through life changing events that will remain with us forever. We begin having doubts in our faith and we question God when the unbearable pain touches our lives. How can we manage to fight this if our faith is weak? We can remind ourselves of what Jesus had done for His disciples... be ready and prepared and be loyal with our faith. For we need to rise and not be afraid because He will not abandon us.

As we pray: "By His Transfiguration, enlighten our path that we may dare to suffer with Him and so share in the everlasting glory of Him who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, One God forever. AMEN."
