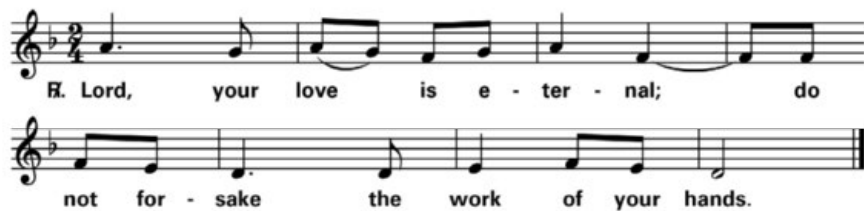

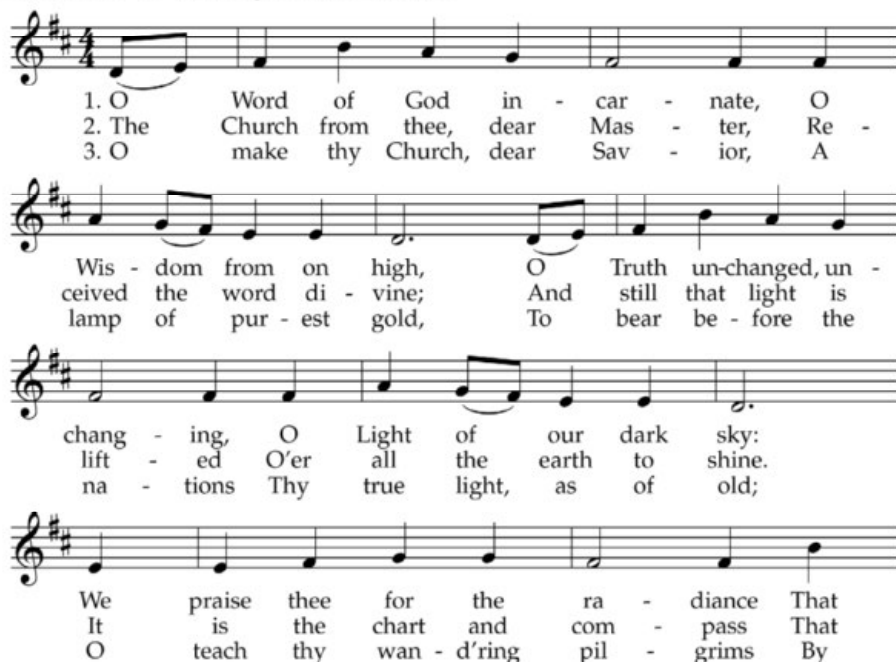

"No, Christ is not Jesus's Last Name"

In older translations of the Bible, the terms "messiah," and "christ," were often used to simply mean "anointed." In fact, the words share a common definition in their respective ancient Greek and Hebrew. The Greek *Khristós* (Χριστός) and the Hebrew *mashach* both mean "anoint." Just think of the words "Christ" and "Chrism," coincidence? In the time of Jesus, references to "messiahs" were common. Whether a revered king, wandering prophet, or high-priest, there were dozens of so-called "messiahs" back then. However, while these words did garner respect in those days, their verbal significance is certainly greater in a modern Catholic context. For example, certain translations of the Bible refer to major figures like Cyrus the Great as a "messiah," but recently Catholics have come to reserve this term only for Jesus, himself.

While the original definition has been largely forgotten, the Apostles in the Gospel story today would have been more familiar with its archaic connotation. After speculating over the identity of the "Son of Man," guessing the names of many "messiahs" of old, the discussion shifted from "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" to "Who do YOU say that I am?" This is when Peter made the connection that this messiah, Jesus, was anointed by God, himself.

So why does this interaction matter? Primarily, we are emboldened to proclaim, like Peter, that Jesus is God, who subsequently gives Peter the keys to heaven and creates the Catholic Church. Additionally, in a linguistic sense, it is possible that this story is part of the reason we use the terms "Messiah" and "Christ" in the colloquial sense we now know. This the point in history where the terms "Christ" and "Messiah" no longer simply meant "an anointed one," but rather, "THE anointed one." (FULL REFLECTION ONLINE)

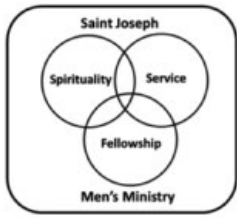
infirmary and kitchen that caters to ill patients and families awaiting childbirth.
