

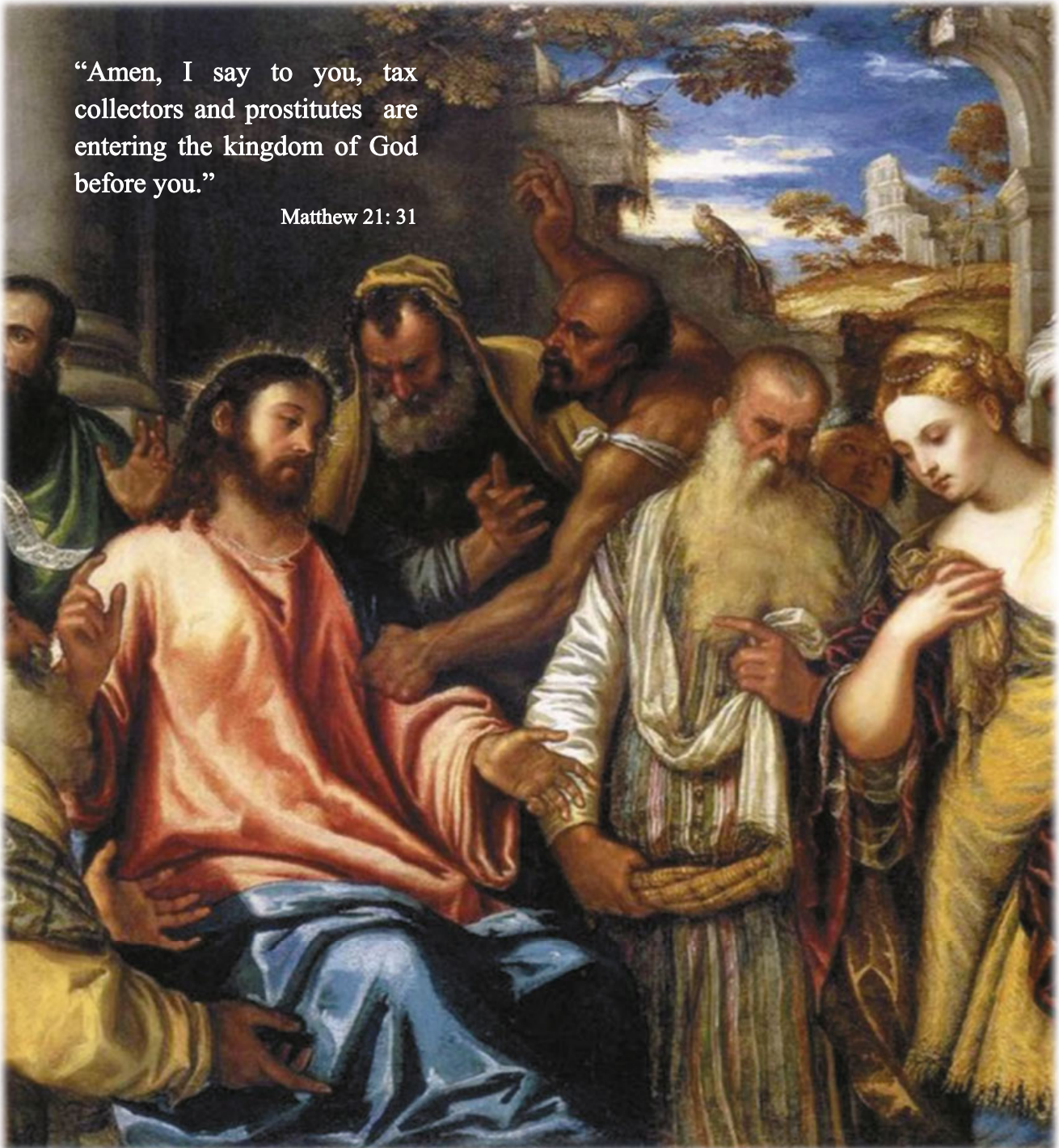

What's Happening in the Parking Lot?



Paving has been removed from several parking spaces at the south end of the parish hall. A 5 to 6 foot high masonry wall covered with stucco and painted to match the church is being built to surround new air conditioning and heating equipment. When the new equipment is fully operational sometime in 2024, we will no longer burn natural gas to heat the building. Heat pumps will electrically heat and air condition the church and hall. The two accessible parking spaces will be replaced near the new, gently sloping walkway from the parking lot to the church and hall on the east side of the building. The stairs at the entrance have been removed.



Museum Repair Update

Plywood protection for the

adobe walls and windows and noise insulation have been installed behind the green safety and security fence. Most of the major construction equipment has been delivered and staged. The specialized drilling equipment needed for our project is in high demand. Work at other locations has delayed its arrival at our location until now. Scaffolding for the drilling rig has been built. This will be followed by testing to ensure everything is functioning properly.
