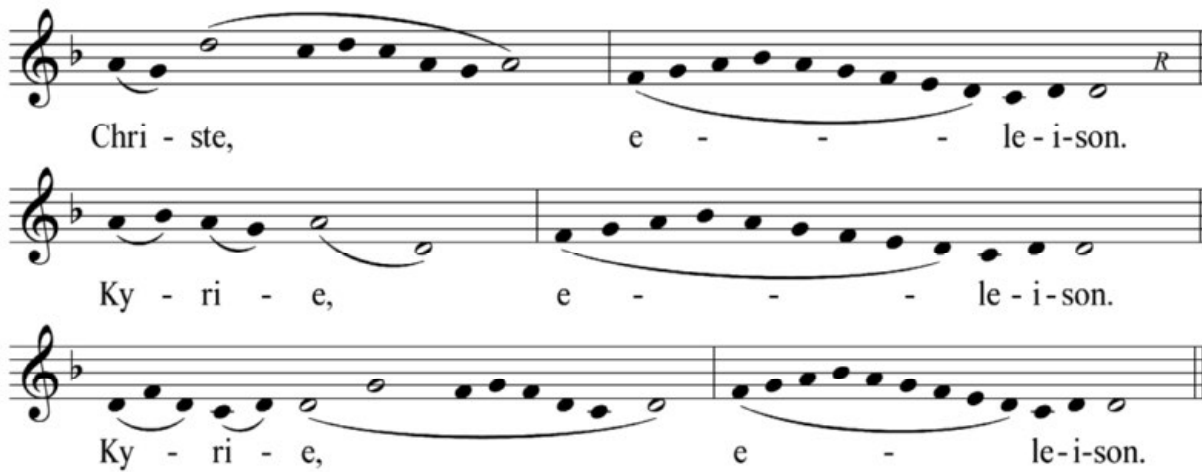

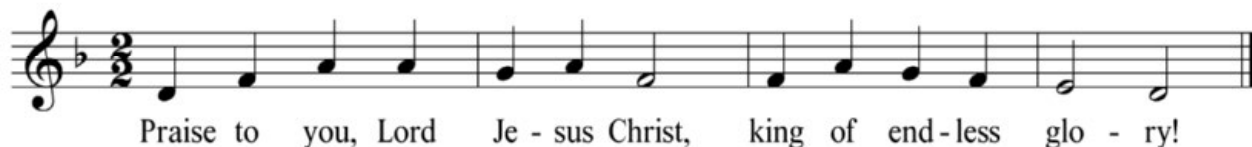
SECOND READING - *Romans 8:31b-34*

GOSPEL - *Mark 9:2-10*

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves.
