

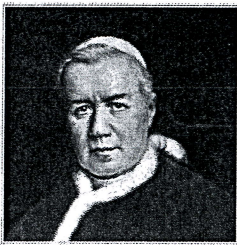
# THE RELICS



## BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS (1991 - 2006)

An Italian youth who created the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition and is the first “millennial” to be beatified.

“TO ALWAYS BE CLOSE TO JESUS,

## POPE SAINT PIUS X (1835 - 1914)

The “Pope of the Eucharist” who condemned the heresies of Modernism and took as his motto:

“INSTAURARE OMNIA IN CHRISTO”  
(*To restore all things in Christ*)



## SAINT JUNIPERO SERRA, OFM (1713 - 1784)

The founder of the California Missions and protector of the Indians, who brought the Gospel where it had never been brought before.

“SIEMPRE ADELANTE, NUNCA ATRÁS”  
(*Always forward, never back*)



## SAINT TERESA OF CALCUTTA (1910 - 1997)

Gonxha Agnes Bojaxhiu joined the Sisters of Loreto at the age of eighteen as Sister Mary Teresa (in honor of St. Thérèse of Lisieux) and was sent to India to teach. Having heard the “call within a call,” she began to minister to the poor and sick in the slums of Calcutta, eventually founding the Missionaries of Charity.
