THE SPIRITUAL SIGNIFICANCE AND RELEVANCE OF MISSION SAN JOSÉ LIE IN:

- 1. Connection to St. Joseph:** The Mission is dedicated to and named after St. Joseph, the protector of the Universal Church. It is under his protection that the Mission will continue to carry forward the torch of faith.
- 2. Sacred Ground:** The Mission Church and grounds are set apart as holy ground, creating an atmosphere of reverence, peace, and contemplation, which foster a deep sense of prayer and devotion to God and to St. Joseph.
- 3. Healing and Intercession:** Many Catholic shrines are associated with miraculous healings, answered prayers, and the intercession of the saints, offering hope and solace to pilgrims seeking spiritual and physical healing. This shrine will serve as a place of healing and peace for all who journey here.
- 4. Evangelization:** Mission San José was born out of the Lord's great Commission to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). The early missionaries did not come to build the Mission for its own sake, but for the Glory of God and the salvation of souls. The Mission is a mission only if it continues to serve as a powerful and living symbol of the Catholic faith, drawing people to the Gospel message and inspiring evangelization.
- 5. Community Building:** This shrine will unite the faithful across cultures, languages, and borders, fostering a sense of unity and solidarity in the global Catholic family.
- 6. Encounter with the Divine Lord:** This shrine will continue to provide a space for pilgrims, Christians, and others to experience a deeper connection with God, encountering His love, mercy, and presence in a unique and transformative way.

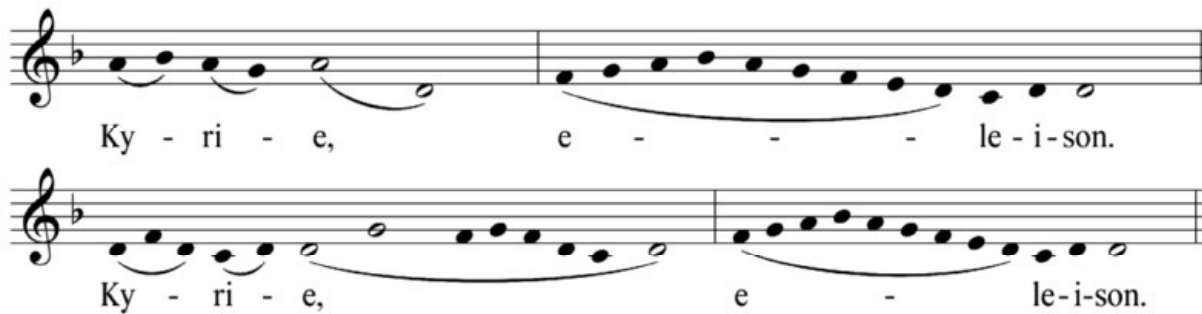

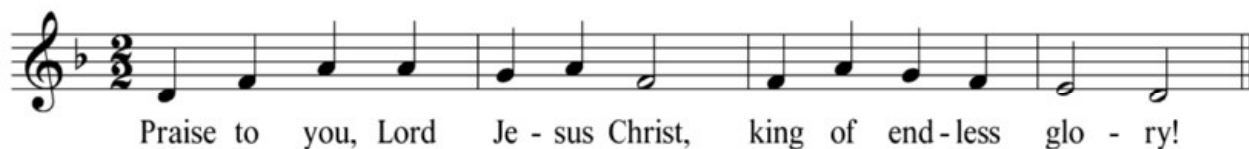
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SECOND READING - *Hebrews 5:7-9*
