DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

As we celebrate Easter, we are reminded that life is a precious gift from God. However, sin and death, the devil's doing, can often distort this gift. When we abuse our freedom by doing wrong, we become victims of sin and death. But God does not let us remain in this state. He became human and bore the weight of sin and death so that we may know that death is not the end, but life in God is our final destiny. He died and rose again to prove that life is more powerful than death. Death is a moment of history and life is eternity in God.

This incredible sacrificial act of love should fill us with gratitude and compel us to share the great news of Jesus' death and Resurrection with others.

There are three ways to live out this gratitude: Firstly, we can actively participate in the life of the church through liturgical events and celebrations. God offers himself to us in these moments, so that we can be fed and grow.

Secondly, we can become missionary disciples, eager to learn and share God's love with others. We simply cannot love what we don't know. We cannot know if

we don't learn at the feet of the Lord and the mother Church. If we don't know the Lord, our love of God is simply empty of meaning!

Lastly, we can translate our faith into concrete actions, performing works of charity and mercy that demonstrate our love for God and neighbor. Our parish offers all many opportunity to do so, ranging from Homeless Ministry to St Vincent De Paul Society, and Refugee ministry. Thus, personal offerings to God, to the Church, and the less fortunate are morally right things that help us becoming like Christ and make Christ visible to others.

May this Easter season be a time of renewal and joy, as we embrace the gift of life and share the hope of the resurrection with all those around us.

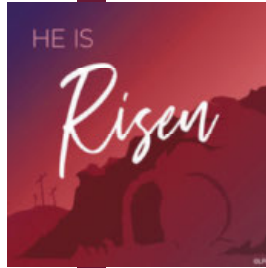
