Please observe reverent silence as we prepare ourselves for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

DEAR PEOPLE OF GOD,

Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, received a series of revelations from Jesus Christ in the 1930s that would change the course of Catholic spirituality and popular devotion.

Through her writings, Jesus conveyed three main messages of Divine Mercy that are just as relevant today as they were then.

Firstly, God's mercy is greater than our sins. St. Faustina recorded Jesus' words: "My mercy is poured out upon the world, but men shut their eyes to it." (Diary, 1528) God's love is unfathomable, and He desires to forgive and redeem us, no matter our past mistakes.

Secondly, we must trust in Jesus and open ourselves to receiving His mercy. St. Faustina wrote, "Jesus, I trust in You" (Diary, 1541), a phrase that has become a mantra for Divine Mercy devotees. By surrendering our fears, doubts, and weaknesses to Jesus, we can experience His transformative mercy.

Thirdly, we must extend love and forgiveness to others as God does to us. St. Faustina recorded Jesus' plea: "Be merciful even as your heavenly Father is merciful" (Diary, 664). As vessels of Divine Mercy, we must pour out love, kindness, and compassion on those around us, especially those most in need.

Through St. Faustina's writings, Jesus' message of Divine Mercy has resonated with millions worldwide. By embracing these three messages, we can experience God's boundless love and become instruments of mercy in a world that sorely needs it.

In the embrace of Divine Mercy's boundless love, we are called to extend our compassion beyond ourselves. Today, we are called to respond to the 2024 Bishop's Ministries Appeal which supports vital religious education and formation programs for thousands of youth and adults within our diocese. From initial formation into retirement, the Diocese also provides support for our priests, embodying the very essence of mercy and compassion. Your participation in the Appeal allows us to extend the reach of God's mercy in tangible ways, enriching the lives of countless individuals of all ages in our community.

We invite you immediately after Mass to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. May you experience the Mercy of God always.



On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand

into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.


