DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST.

As we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent, our attention is drawn to the silent yet pivotal figure of Saint Joseph. Though often overlooked during the Advent season, Joseph's presence is palpable, and his virtues offer valuable lessons for us as we prepare to commemorate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In today's Gospel, we witness Mary's selfless journey to aid her cousin Elizabeth, a trek fraught with danger for a pregnant woman (Luke 1:39-56). It is inconceivable that Joseph would not have accompanied Mary on this perilous path, given his knowledge of her divine pregnancy. This subtle yet significant detail speaks to Joseph's unwavering dedication and presence in the life of Mary and Jesus.

As we reflect on the virtues that make Saint Joseph an exemplary guide for us, we are struck by his unshakeable faithfulness. Joseph's initial plans were set aside when the angel revealed Mary's extraordinary situation (Matthew 1:20-24). This righteous man prioritized God's will and Mary's needs above his own, demonstrating a selflessness that would become a hallmark of his character.

It is likely that our Lord Jesus, growing up under Joseph's mentorship, learned the value of faithfulness and obedience to God's will. Jesus' own journey, from incarnation to crucifixion and resurrection, was a testament to his unwavering commitment to fulfilling the Father's will (Hebrews 10:9).

Saint Joseph's presence is a recurring theme throughout the Gospel narratives. Though often unseen, his influence is palpable, a reminder that our actions and decisions can have a profound impact on those around us.

Reflection Questions:

- How can we, like Saint Joseph, prioritize God's will and the needs of others above our own plans and desires?
- 2. In what ways can we, like Mary, trust in God's providence and provision, even when faced with uncertainty and challenge?
- 3. How can we, like Jesus, commit ourselves to doing God's will, even when it requires sacrifice and obedience?

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us draw inspiration from Saint Joseph's exemplary virtues. May his faithfulness, presence, and commitment to doing God's will guide us as we strive to follow in the footsteps of our Lord.

We warmly invite you to join us for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Holy Masses as we come together to celebrate the birth of our Savior. Let us rejoice in His coming and share the joy of this holy season with one another.





MISSION RENEWAL PROJECT

History and People of Mission San José

Mission San José lasted for 37 years. It became the secondlargest mission after San Luis Rey. Mission San José and Mission Santa Clara exported the most cattle hides. About 1,900 Indians lived here in 1831.

- Many people lived or worked here. The Spanish
 Fathers, the native Indians and the Spanish soldiers
 were most important.
 - a. Date Founded: June 11, 1797
 - b. Order: Fourteenth
 - c. Founded By: Padre Fermin Francisco de Lasuen
 - d. Official Name: La Mision del Gloriosisimo Patriarch Señor San José
 - e. Other Names: Saint Joseph's
 - f. Named For: Saint Joseph (José in Spanish)
 Patron Saint of the Catholic church
 - g. Location: Fremont, CA

2. Finding a Place for the Mission

- a. By 1796, thirteen Spanish missions stood in what is now Alta California.
- Mission Presidente Padre Lasuen and the Spanish Governor got together to fill in the gaps and build five more missions.
- c. Mission San José was the first one. It was the only Spanish mission east of San Francisco Bay.

Founding the Mission The First Year, May-December, 1797

- Within 3 weeks, seven buildings were laid out, arranged in a rectangle, not a square like other missions.
 - a. Wood with thatched roofs.
 - b. Other missions gave cattle and supplies to help Mission San José get started.

2. June, 1797

- a. Fathers Isidoro Barcenilla and Augustin Merino arrived.
 - i. new missionaries from Mexico City
 - ii. came to run the mission
- Seventy Indians moved to Mission San José. They came from Mission Santa Clara. Some had relatives living nearby. Others used to live in the area.



History and People of Mission San José

c. Rumors claimed runaway Indians would attack people working at Mission San José. Raymundo led the runaways. On July 3 and July 6, there were more rumors. They said that Indians planned to attack the nearby town of San José, too.

3. July 7, 1797

- a. Spanish soldiers came from San Francisco led by Sergeant Pedro Amador.
- b. Caught 20 runaway Indians.

4. Sept. 2, 1797

- a. First baptism, 24-year-old woman, Gilpae.
- b. The Fathers changed her name to Josefa.
- c. Father Catala from Mission Santa Clara baptized her because Barcenilla and Merino did not know the Ohlone language yet.
- Sept. 18, 1797 First burial of a mission Indian was held.
- **6. Sept. 24, 1797** First marriage of an Indian couple took place.
- 7. End of 1797 Total baptisms: 33 Indian people in 6 months.

1798-1820: Mission Growth

1. Spring, 1798

- Fathers tried to convert Taunan Indians who lived nearby.
 - i. Indians got upset. Said they would attack.
- b. Sergeant Pedro Amador went to the Indian village on April 13.
 - i. Brought 26 Indians back.
 - ii. Indians said they wanted to be Christians.
 - iii. The Fathers baptized them on April 17.
 - Baptized 12 more Taunan Indian adults in the next two weeks.


