

### DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST,

As we journey through Lent, let us reflect on the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness. The scripture reveals that the Lord was tempted by the devil, exposing the reality that we are all vulnerable to Satan's lies.

*There is a lie of physical satisfaction.* Satan's first temptation was to entice Jesus to turn rocks into bread, appealing to His physical hunger. This deception aims to reduce our focus to mere physical sustenance, ignoring the deeper hunger of our souls. Jesus' response, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4), highlights the importance of spiritual nourishment.

*There is a lie of power and control.* The second temptation promised Jesus dominion over all nations, seducing Him with the prospect of power and control. This lie distorts reality, as Satan was not granted authority over all nations. Jesus' rebuttal, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only" (Matthew 4:10), reaffirms the sole sovereignty of God.

*There is a lie of testing God.* The third temptation goaded Jesus into testing God's validity, questioning His reliability. This deception aims to manipulate God into doing our bidding, rather than submitting to His will. Jesus' response, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test" (Matthew 4:7), emphasizes the importance of humility and trust in our relationship with God.

The Lord unmasks all of Satan's lies with truth. Satan's temptations are cunningly disguised as good things

but are, in reality, filled with poison. Jesus' responses, rooted in truth, expose the lies and reaffirm God's sovereignty.

As we navigate the temptations of our own lives, let us remember that we are not just physical beings but also spiritual ones. We need not only food for the body but also nourishment for the soul, which comes from the Word of God. We are called not to worship this world or anyone, but God alone! We are called to get all with God in humility and not to test him!

#### Let us reject the lies of Satan and instead:

- **1.** Seek spiritual sustenance through prayer, reflection, and scripture.
- 2. Recognize God's sovereignty and submit to His will.
- 3. Approach God with humility, trusting in His goodness and providence.

We invite you to be an active member of our parish community, contributing your time, talents, and treasure to build God's kingdom on earth. Together, let us expand the reach of God's love, defeating lies and saving souls.

May this Lenten season be a time of spiritual renewal, as we unmask Satan's deceptions and walk in the truth of God's Word.




