THE WOMAN AT THE WELL: A DIVINE ENCOUNTER

DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST,

God always finds ways to bring us closer to Him, often in the moments when we least expect it—or when we feel least worthy. The story of the woman at the well, found in John 4, is a beautiful testament to this truth. It's a narrative of grace, redirection, and the relentless love of a Savior who seeks out the lost, even when they're hiding in plain sight.

Picture the scene: a Samaritan woman approaches a well in the heat of the day, likely to avoid the judgmental eyes of her community. She's alone, carrying the weight of her past and the burden of her present. She's there for water—simple, ordinary water to meet her physical needs. But then, she encounters Jesus, who is waiting for her. This is no chance meeting; the Lord deliberately crosses cultural, social, and religious boundaries to initiate a dialogue with her. He sees her—not just her actions or her reputation, but her soul—and He refuses to let her remain hidden.

At first, she tries to keep the conversation surface-level. “You’re a Jew, I’m a Samaritan—how can you ask me for a drink?” she says, deflecting with practicalities (John 4:9). She wants to talk about water, the well, and the mechanics of drawing it. But Jesus gently shifts the focus. “If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water” (John 4:10). He’s not interested in the temporary; He’s offering what truly satisfies the heart’s deepest desire—eternal life, forgiveness, and a relationship with God. The woman came for a bucket of water, but Jesus invites her to drink from a well that never runs dry.

As the conversation unfolds, she pivots again, clinging to what’s familiar. She brings up Jacob, the patriarch who dug the well, perhaps hoping to anchor herself in tradition or debate theology. “Are you greater than our

father Jacob?” she asks (John 4:12). It’s a fair question—Jacob was a towering figure in her heritage. But Jesus doesn’t get sidetracked. He directs her beyond the past, beyond the physical well, to Himself as the source of all truth. “Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst,” He tells her (John 4:14). He reveals Himself as the fulfillment of every promise, the One greater than Jacob, the Messiah she didn’t even know she was waiting for.

What’s remarkable is how Jesus meets her where she is. He doesn’t shy away from her reality—her broken relationships, her shame—but He doesn’t condemn her either. Instead, He offers her dignity and purpose. When she finally recognizes Him, she leaves her water jar behind and runs to tell her village, “Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?” (John 4:29). The woman who once hid in the noonday sun becomes a herald of the good news, drawing others to Christ.

This encounter reminds us that God seeks us out, even when we try to hide. We may come to Him with small concerns—our daily “water”—but He longs to give us so much more. We may cling to what we know, like traditions or beliefs we’ve inherited, but He gently redirects us to the truth of who He is. The woman at the well didn’t just find water that day; she found living water, and her life was forever changed.

So, dear friends, let us approach the well of God’s grace with open hearts. Let us listen when He calls, trust when He redirects, and run to share the good news of the One who knows us fully and loves us still.

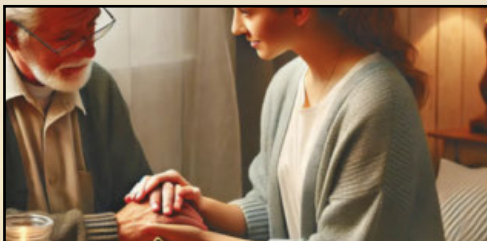
Pastoral Care: Bringing Christ's Love to Those in Need—Part II

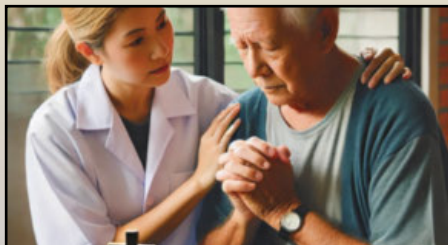

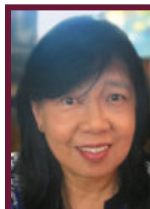

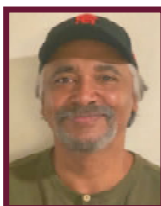
