

### DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your prayers and support during our recent visit to our sister parish. It was a truly blessed experience. We met Fr. George, the pastor, and all the ministry leaders, and we saw with our own eyes how our gifts are helping to build God's kingdom in a remote part of Ghana.

Our hearts overflow with gratitude and thanksgiving as we worked together to advance the mission of the Church. We joined them in praying the 14 Stations of the Cross and celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We danced and ate together. We shared and exchanged our thoughts and prayers. It was a good time of friendship and unity.

The whole setting felt like stepping into the ancient biblical world where Mary, Jesus, and Joseph lived. The dry season brought intense heat, houses were simply built, and goats and sheep roamed freely across the landscape. Life there is simple, stripped of modern comforts, yet rich in faith. The weather and living conditions were far from ideal, but the people dressed in their very best to honor God and the mysteries of our faith. Their belief in the Lord is unshakable, and they worship Him with all their hearts. We visited a place called St. Padre Pio—a humble pavilion where children gather, with no church building yet. On some Sundays, the Holy Mass is offered there, a simple but powerful sign of their trust in God.

Their faith reminded me of the story of Lazarus in the Gospel of John. When Jesus arrived at the tomb, Lazarus had been dead for four days, and all hope seemed lost. Yet, through faith in the Lord, Lazarus was raised to life again. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die" (John 11:25).

In a similar way, the people we met in Ghana face hardships that might bury others in despair poverty, isolation, and struggle. But their faith in the Lord is their survival, their light in the darkness. Like Lazarus, they are brought to life through their trust in God, rising above their circumstances with hope and joy in a world not unlike the one Jesus walked.

Thank you for being part of this journey with us. Your support is a lifeline, helping their faith—and ours— continue to grow and bear fruit for God's glory.

SVDP and Homeless Outreach Ministry Devoted to Works of Mercy Since 1959, St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) has served the St. Joseph community,

providing food and essentials to approximately 900 individuals and families each month, distributing aid every Tuesday and Thursday from the back of the

church. The Homeless Outreach Ministry (HOM), launched on December 8, 2024, reaches people living in tents, vehicles, encampments, and on the



streets. Founded by parishioner Stan Peters, HOM began as a grassroots effort from his home and now operates officially from the newly renovated Carriage House, renamed the St. Joseph Workshop. Volunteers pack and deliver supplies on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. Our parish has long supported SVDP through the 5th Sunday second collection. Now, with HOM established, we will alternate this collection between the two ministries. Watch the bulletin for upcoming collection dates and look for envelopes in the mail. 




