
#### Living the Mission with Christ

- Our operating income is derived primarily from parishioners through the offertory plate collections.
- Last year, 248 responded to our Living the Mission with Christ stewardship program.
- 52% made a commitment to increase their giving and our 2024 offertory increased by \$106,000.



To thrive as a parish, we need everyone to help us keep up with inflation and rising costs.



Through May 31 our offertory income is \$14,419 below budget.

Total income is \$21,445 below budget.

#### Stewardship = Gratitude



- Catholic stewardship recognizes that all gifts, talents, time, and treasure are blessings from God
- As **good stewards** we use them responsibly for the greater good, including serving others and building God's Kingdom.
- It is a **way of life** that prioritizes God's priorities, involves prayer, service, and financial giving, and ultimately aims to return these gifts with increase to the Lord.
- It involves commitment to living in a way that reflects gratitude for God's gifts.

#### Stewardship = Participation



- A minority of our parishioners participate in parish ministries and events and contribute the majority of our offertory income.
- Our parish family cannot flourish when only some participate and a minority carries the weight of all.
- We are all members of God's Holy Church.
- And the Church depends on every member for our presence, prayer, active participation, and financial support.



#### Stewardship = Sustainability



We prayerfully ask every adult member of our parish to offer the value of one hour of their wages per week if they are able, or a weekly contribution of at least \$20.



Your **regular and consistent** donations reflect faith, gratitude, and care. Each contribution supports our mission, ministries, and sacred places.

#### Stewardship = Reaching Out



- Stewardship is a matter of faith, of participation, and of *invitation*.
- We are called to reach out gently, lovingly, and consistently — to fellow parishioners, friends, colleagues, even family members.
- Some may be near us every Sunday, yet remain unengaged in our parish family.

## Diocesan Bankruptcy Update





- The Diocese filed for bankruptcy two years ago on May 8, 2023. Progress has been made but many challenges lie ahead.
- The Diocese's financial plan to emerge from bankruptcy has two equally important goals:
  - 1) to be fair to the survivors and victims of past child sexual abuse, and
  - 2) to allow the Diocese to emerge from bankruptcy able to continue its mission to serve the faithful and our community.

## Diocesan Bankruptcy Update





- The Diocese's plan exceeds on a per-abuse claim basis – survivor payments in other diocesan bankruptcy cases comparable to ours.
- Unfortunately, because of the ongoing costs of the bankruptcy case, the Diocese is running out of resources and has had to freeze withdrawal of unrestricted parish savings. This affects \$1.1 million of our parish savings.
- This temporary freeze does not affect donorrestricted contributions to our parish capital campaigns and to special projects.

All are fully-funded by restricted donations and are not part of the parish operating budget.






## Ohlone Memorial Garden Statues



#### Title: The Family of Jesus

- Jesus is sharing a meal with an Ohlone family, young Carlo Acutis, and an Asian and African child.
- They represent the people of the world gathered around Jesus.
- There are two fish and five loaves representing Jesus feeding the 5,000.
- The statues show the harmony and happiness of Jesus' family when we gather to share the bread of life.





## Lisa Dang

Pastoral Leadership Team Mission Ambassador Coordinator



- Inspired by God's Great Commandment, early Franciscan missionaries risked their lives to come to California.
- Their goal was to bring the Catholic faith to the native people.
- Mission San José was founded by Padre Fermín Lasuén on June 11, 1797.
- We were the 14th of the 21 missions in present-day California.





- Thousands of Ohlone people converted to Christianity.
- Mission San José continued to grow as a center of faith.
- Mission San José was the third most successful of the 21 California missions.



- The original adobe church was built by the Franciscans and the Ohlone people and was completed in 1809.
- Mission San José became Saint Joseph Parish in 1853.



- The Mission Church and other mission buildings were destroyed by an earthquake in 1868 except for the museum building.
- The Mission Church was authentically reconstructed by the Diocese starting in 1982 and rededicated March 19, 1985.



- The Mission Church and museum were history-focused sites that now embrace both history and faith.
- The Mission Church became the Diocesan Shrine of St. Joseph on March 19, 2024.

- ❖ The Mission Museum was closed for renovation June 1, 2024 and reopened on December 14-15, 2024.
- 11 showcase rooms highlighting mission history and culture.
- Pilgrim Center to warmly welcome guests and visitors.
- St. Joseph Chapel of Healing: Special Mass held on the 19th of each month.





# Gross Sales YTD (Jan to June) 2022 to 2025



- In the prior years, Museum operating expenses exceeded revenue generated.
- Expenses: Salaries, Benefits, Upkeep, Utilities, Insurance.
- Museum was subsidized by a generous 2004 bequest and more recently by the parish operating budget.



#### Reimagined Museum





- Creating the St. Joseph Chapel of Healing.
- Promoting group pilgrimages by diocesan parishes and their ministries.
- Establishing the Mission as the Diocesan Shrine of St. Joseph.
- The Mission is a Diocesan pilgrimage site for the entire 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope.









- Restocking the gift shop with new merchandise.
- Increasing tour admission fees to comparable amount as other California Missions.
- Recruiting and training more Mission Ambassadors.

- Continuing to promote Mission and Museum tours to schools.




