DEAREST BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



The days are growing shorter, darker, and gloomier as we approach the end of the calendar year. We are also nearing the close of the liturgical year. This Sunday marks the second-to-last Sunday in Ordinary Time, and in just

two weeks, we will enter the holy season of Advent, preparing our hearts for the coming of Christmas. At this time of year, the readings of the Church also take on a more somber tone. They remind us of the "last things" our faith teaches us to contemplate: death, judgment, heaven and hell.

When will the end of time come? We do not know. It could be this year, next year, or in the distant future. The early Christians believed in a physical end to the world, and many thought it would come soon. Some even stopped working, thinking there was no point. But St. Paul firmly opposed this attitude, writing in the second reading: "Anyone who does not work should not eat." St. Paul reminds us that until Jesus returns to bring creation to perfection, we must not live in idleness. Rather than wasting time speculating about when the world will end, we are called to work diligently and faithfully. Indeed, the more we reflect on the end of the world, the more urgently we should live our lives with purpose.

Yet there is also a deeper, spiritual meaning in these reflections on the end times. It is not simply about the world's physical end, but about how *you and I are living right now*. The prophet Malachi in the second reading reminds us that one day, each of us

must stand before the Lord and give an account of our lives. Many people today no longer believe this. Some place their hope in ideas such as reincarnation or being born again. But we Christians believe that we are given one life, and at its end, we will stand before God to account for how we have used it.

If we are honest, most of us have not always used our lives well. We have good intentions but get distracted. Sometimes we are drawn by the desires of the flesh, other times by the pursuit of power, or by worrying too much about what others think of us.

In the Catholic understanding of Scripture, the "final days" are always before us. That means we must be ready to meet the Lord **now**—at this very moment. There is no time to waste.

If we need to repent of a sin—now is the time.

If we want to thank God for His blessings—now is the time.

If we need to forgive someone—now is the time.

Scripture tells us that **now** is the day of salvation. **Now** is the time when the Lord is near, offering His mercy and love.

Let us, then, celebrate this Sunday as if it were our last—faithfully, joyfully, and with hearts ready to meet our Savior.
