WARM GREETINGS FROM VIETNAM



*Happy Weekend to Everyone,
In the Gospel of this Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, John the Baptist describes Jesus twice as the Lamb of God: "This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world."*

For us in the 21st century, these words may sound unusual or even strange. But for a first-century Jew, they would have been deeply meaningful.

In the Old Testament, when people sinned against God, a lamb was sacrificed as an offering of atonement. The image of the lamb also appears in the Book of Revelation, chapter 5, where John has a vision of a scroll containing a crucial message from God. No one is found worthy or powerful enough to open it. Then John hears a voice saying, *"Do not weep! See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah has triumphed. He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals."* We might expect a mighty lion to appear—but instead, John sees a Lamb, seemingly weak and meek.

Yet this Lamb has the power to take away the sins of the world. God's power is revealed not through force, but through humility and sacrifice. The world wanted power, and God sent a tiny, vulnerable baby. The world wanted a king, and God sent a Savior. The world wanted a lion, and God sent a Lamb. The world laughed and rejected this gift—as it still does today—but through that Baby, the power of life was released.

As the poet George MacDonald beautifully wrote:

*"They all were looking for a King
To slay their foes and lift them high;
He came a little baby thing
Who made a woman cry."*

There is a story of a young boy who spent many hours building a model sailboat. One day, he placed it in a nearby river, but strong winds and currents quickly carried it away. Heartbroken, he knew how much effort it would take to build another. Downriver, a man found the boat, took it to town, and sold it to a toy store. Some time later, the boy passed by the store and recognized his boat in the window. He explained what had happened, but the shopkeeper did not believe him and said the only way to get it back was to buy it. The boy used his last penny to reclaim the boat. Holding it close, he said, *"Little boat, now you're twice mine: I made you, and I bought you."*

That is exactly what God has done for us. We belong to Him twice over. He created us, and when we were lost, He redeemed us—not with money, but with His own blood, the blood of the Lamb.

Today, as we receive the Lamb of God, may we do so from the depths of our hearts—filled with gratitude for His love and with a sincere desire to love Him in return.





