FISHERS OF MEN



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
If you were asked to choose people to turn the world upside down, whom would you pick? Some might name powerful politicians, brilliant lawyers, influential writers, or successful CEOs—people with intelligence, influence, and authority. Yet Jesus chose none of these. Instead, he chose fishermen. Why fishermen?

First, fishermen must have **patience**. Anyone who has gone fishing knows that fish cannot be rushed. A fisherman waits quietly, sometimes for hours, until the fish takes the bait. Impatience leads to empty nets. In the same way, patience is essential in the Christian life. Love itself is patient. Whether we are dealing with family, community, or the slow work of God in our own hearts, patience is often our greatest challenge.

Second, fishermen must have **perseverance**. A good fisherman does not give up easily. He may return home with nothing one day, but he will try again the next. Failure is part of the journey. Without it, success would have little meaning. The road to truth is never smooth, and the path to holiness is often blocked by obstacles. Yet the disciple keeps going, trusting that God will bring fruit from faithful effort.

Third, fishermen need **courage**. Fishing often involves risk—rough seas, strong winds, and sudden storms. A fisherman must be ready to face danger. Likewise, Christians must recognize that there is always risk in living and speaking the truth. To follow Christ courageously means standing firm in faith even when it is uncomfortable or unpopular.

Fourth, fishermen must have **a sense of timing**. A wise fisherman knows that there are times when it is pointless to cast the net. He understands when to act and when to wait. So too in the Christian life. There is a time to speak and a time to be silent, a time to act and a time to pray. Discernment and wisdom guide the disciple's mission.

Finally, a fisherman must **remain out of sight**. If he draws attention to himself—even his shadow—the fish will not bite. In the same way, a true fisher of men does not point others to himself but to Jesus Christ. This requires humility. As Saint John the Baptist said, "He must increase, and I must decrease."

More than two thousand years ago, Jesus astonished the world by calling simple, poor fishermen to be his disciples. He did so because he saw in them the very qualities needed for his mission. Today, Christ continues to call each of us to be fishers of men. He does not seek those whom the world admires most, but humble hearts that are willing to learn, trust, and serve.

To be good fishers of men, we need patience, perseverance, courage, wisdom in timing, and humility. God can use us regardless of our status or position. May he inspire us with these virtues so that we may faithfully continue Christ's mission, winning souls for his Kingdom.





NOP—Neighborhood Outreach Project began

HOM First Year at St. Joseph—We successfully completed our first year as a new ministry, serving the unhoused in Fremont through the dedication of 40+ volunteers and the generous support of our parish community. From Dec 2024–Nov 2025, HOM delivered 4,877 grocery bags at a total cost of \$43,850—an average of 406 bags per month. We are

especially thankful for Sr. John Marie's Pantry (SJMP) for providing \$1,000/month in support during this first year. Beginning in 2026, HOM will operate with 28% less funding, as SJMP support ended Dec 2025. 
