FULFILLING THE LAW THROUGH MERCY AND LOVE



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's Gospel comes from the Sermon on the Mount, where Matthew presents Jesus as the New Moses. Just as Moses went up Mount Sinai to receive the Law from

God, Jesus goes up the mountain and begins to teach. But instead of simply repeating the Law, Jesus brings it to its fulfillment. He makes it clear: *"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."*

To understand this teaching, it helps to recall what the Law, or Torah, represents. The Torah refers to the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures—Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. Its purpose is not merely to impose rules, but to offer guidance for living, shaping a people who reflect God's holiness and justice. Within the Torah are 613 commandments: 365 prohibitions—things one must not do—and 248 prescriptions—things one must do. While this number may seem overwhelming, these commandments were never meant to be oppressive. They were intended to protect what is essential, sacred, and life-giving.

Yet, even with so many laws, certain situations remained unclear. This is where we begin to see the difference between how the Pharisees and Jesus approach the Law. The Pharisees focused on strict obedience to the letter of the law. Their concern was precise observance—making sure every rule was followed exactly. Jesus, however, directs attention to the spirit of the law. Rather than multiplying rules to regulate behavior, He simplifies the Law by bringing it back to its deepest meaning.

Jesus does this through reinterpretation. He does not discard the commandments; instead, He draws out their true intent. In today's Gospel, He offers powerful examples. The Law says, *"You shall not kill."* Most of us can confidently say we have kept this commandment. But Jesus goes further, saying, *"Whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment."* In other words, the issue is not only violent action but the anger, resentment, and contempt that live in the human heart.

This shift marks the movement from old to new—not from bad to good, but from external compliance to internal transformation. The old law emphasized avoiding evil: do not kill, do not commit adultery, do not steal. Jesus calls us beyond this minimum standard toward active goodness: love your enemies, forgive those who wrong you, feed the hungry, reconcile with one another.

Jesus fulfills the Law not by adding burdens, but by revealing its heart. Mercy and love are the keys that unlock the meaning of every commandment. As Jesus later teaches, the whole Law and the Prophets depend on love of God and love of neighbor. When mercy and love guide our choices, the Law is no longer a weight we carry but a path that leads to life.

Today's Gospel invites us to move beyond mere rule-keeping and to allow God to transform our hearts. When mercy and love become the foundation of our lives, we truly live the Gospel.


