BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Church invites us to enter more deeply into the mystery of God's love as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Flowing from the joy of the Resurrection, this feast reminds

us that Easter is not only about Christ rising from the dead, but about His mercy reaching every corner of our lives. The risen Jesus Christ comes to His disciples not with judgment or anger, but with a gift: *"Peace be with you."* These are not just words, but a healing presence that restores, forgives, and renews.

In the Gospel, we encounter the familiar figure of Saint Thomas the Apostle. Often remembered for his doubt, Thomas represents all of us at moments when faith feels difficult or uncertain. He wants proof; he wants to see and touch. Yet instead of rejecting him, Jesus meets him exactly where he is—with patience, understanding, and mercy. Thomas's journey from doubt to faith leads him to make one of the most profound professions in Scripture: *"My Lord and my God!"* His story is a powerful reminder that doubt does not disqualify us from faith; rather, when brought honestly before the Lord, it can lead us to a deeper encounter with Him.

This Sunday also draws us to the message of Divine Mercy entrusted to Saint Faustina Kowalska. Through her, Jesus revealed the depth of His compassion for every soul, especially sinners. One of the most striking lines from her diary is this: *"The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy."* These words challenge us to rethink how we see ourselves and others. Too often, we allow shame, guilt, or pride to

keep us distant from God. But Divine Mercy Sunday proclaims that no sin is greater than God's love, and no heart is beyond His reach.

The image of Divine Mercy—Jesus with rays of red and pale light streaming from His heart—visually expresses this truth. The rays symbolize the blood and water that flowed from Christ's side on the Cross, signs of the sacraments and the life of the Church. They remind us that mercy is not an abstract idea, but a living reality poured out for us through Christ's sacrifice and made present to us especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

As we continue to celebrate Easter, we are called not only to receive this mercy but also to become instruments of it. In a world often marked by division, harsh judgment, and wounded relationships, the witness of mercy is more needed than ever. Forgiving someone who has hurt us, offering patience instead of anger, reaching out to someone in need—these are simple yet powerful ways we reflect the mercy of God.

Today, let us open our hearts more fully to the Risen Lord. Let us bring to Him our sins, our doubts, our fears, and our wounds. And with trust, let us pray the simple yet profound words given through Saint Faustina:

Jesus, I trust in You.

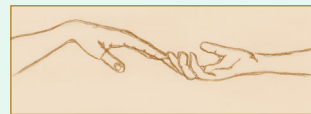

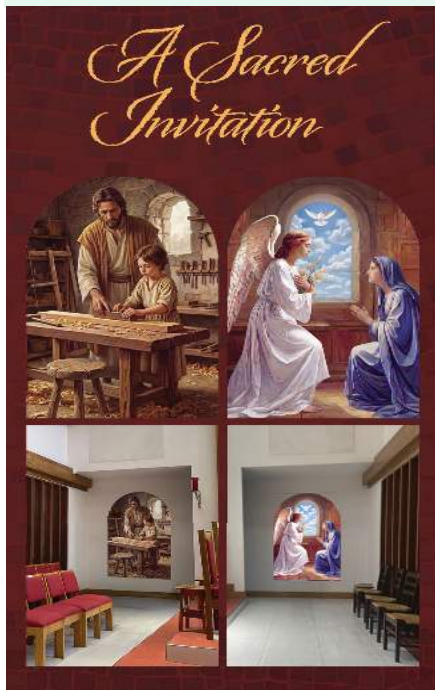

—When the 1868 Earthquake destroyed the original 1809 adobe church, the Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows) painting hung in the Baptistry. Miraculously, it survived the earthquake and was placed in storage

until recently rediscovered by volunteers. The Committee for Restoration of the Mission San Jose (CRMSJ) launched the restoration initiative in 2025 and enough funds from private individuals were donated to start the work. 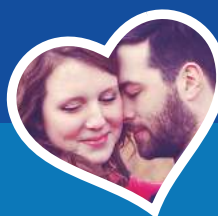
