## WERE NOT OUR HEARTS BURNING WITHIN US?



*My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,*

Today's Gospel gives us one of the most beautiful resurrection stories—the journey to Emmaus. The two disciples were deeply frustrated and discouraged by what had happened to Jesus. They could

not accept the shameful defeat of their Master, whom they had hoped would overthrow the Romans and set them free. The story of the Road to Emmaus is also our story—a story of despair and disappointment, but ultimately a story of conversion and hope. Truly, we are the disciples on that road, and there are many spiritual lessons we can draw from this encounter.

First, we see the two disciples walking along the road in sadness. Their sorrow reflects the fact that they were heading in the wrong direction. Jerusalem is the place of promise and salvation, yet they were turning away from it. In their frustration, they encountered a stranger who would change their lives. This stranger was the risen Christ. This reminds us not to be afraid of strangers. Jesus can come to us in many forms—through people of different backgrounds, beliefs, and experiences. We are called to welcome others with open hearts, for often Jesus comes to us disguised as a stranger.

The second lesson is that God always reaches out to us first. Jesus sought out the two disciples so they could encounter Him and be transformed. In our own journey of life, Jesus is continually seeking us. But why didn't the disciples recognize Him? Because events had not unfolded as they expected. They believed Jesus would redeem Israel through power and glory, not through suffering and the cross. This teaches us that

God's ways are not our ways. What we see as failure may, in fact, be part of God's greater plan. For some, the cross is a sign of defeat, but for those who believe, it is a sign of victory.

The third lesson comes when Jesus breaks the bread, and their eyes are opened. It is in looking back that they understand. In the same way, when we reflect on our lives, we grow in awareness of God's presence and love. Through this reflection, we come to see how His grace is at work within us. At times, we may feel like we are walking through darkness. Outwardly, everything may seem fine, but inwardly our hearts can feel empty. In such moments, we may wonder where God is. Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus is there, walking beside us even when we cannot see Him. If we open our hearts, He listens and responds.

Every Sunday, when we gather for Mass, we relive the story of the Road to Emmaus. In the "I Confess," we acknowledge our sins and struggles. We listen to the Word of God and allow Jesus to speak to our hearts. Then we encounter Him in the Eucharist.

The key question is: What do we do after encountering the Risen Christ? Will we be like the two disciples who turned back, filled with joy to share the Good News? Do we bring this experience into our daily lives? Do we walk with others in their need and welcome strangers as we would welcome Jesus?

If we do these things, then we are truly disciples of Christ. We are Easter people. Alleluia is our song. Amen.

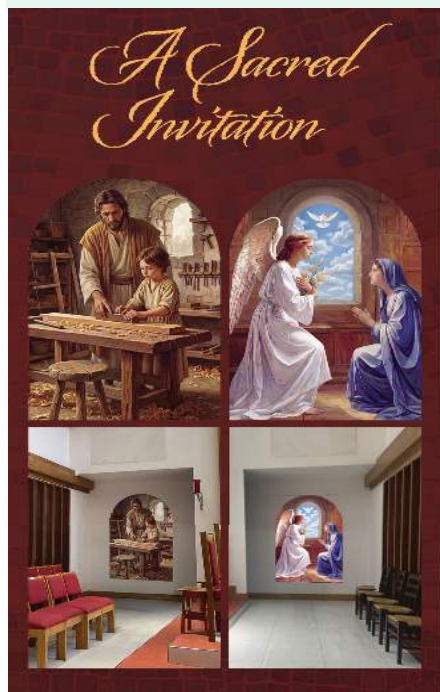

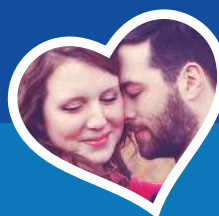
