TRINITY SUNDAY



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross — “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” — we profess our faith in the

Triune God: three Persons in one God. The mystery of the Trinity became a major controversy in the fourth century. A priest named Arius once heard his bishop preach that the Son was equal to the Father. Arius objected strongly. He argued that if the Son were equal to the Father, then there would be two Gods. Instead, he claimed that Jesus was merely the highest of all created beings. From this came the great Trinitarian controversy. Even today, some groups such as the Jehovah’s Witnesses and Mormonism deny the full divinity of Christ.

We may never completely explain how the Trinity works, we can understand why God revealed Himself as Trinity. The best way to understand it is through love. Scripture tells us God is love. But love cannot exist alone. Love must be shared. God cannot simply look in the mirror and say, “Buddy, I love you!” That would be self-love, not the fullness of love. The nature of love is sharing. In other words, love needs an object. Now you may say: If love needs an object, we, human beings, can be an object of God’s love. Yes we can. But St. Augustine would argue that kind of love is not proportional. It is not the right order of love. For instance, a spousal love is rightly ordered to another person, not to a pet. An animal’s love is rightly ordered to another animal, not to a tree. In the same way, divine love is rightly ordered to another divine, not to a creature. Therefore, we believe in Godhead, there is a community of persons whose

love is so rich, so intense, and so hot that it spills over into the world. As the result, the universe was created in this image of Trinitarian love.

The Feast of the Trinity also teaches us an important lesson about human life: no one is meant to live alone. We are created in the image of the Triune God, which means we are made for relationships and community. Today’s culture often promotes radical individualism: “Mind your own business. I don’t need anyone.” But that mentality leaves people isolated and lonely. I remember in my village growing up, people rarely spoke about depression because everyone talked to and cared for each other. When one family ran out of rice, neighbors shared theirs. When we had good food, we shared it. We did not build fences; we built bridges. Through caring relationships, we become true followers of Christ.

The Trinity does not call us to uniformity, but to unity in diversity. In our St Joseph family, we are many persons, different in gifts and personalities, yet united in one faith. No one is greater than another. Every person has equal dignity because all are created in the image of God. The mystery of the Holy Trinity reminds us that “to be is to be in relationship.” We belong to one another. We share one mission: to help one another get to heaven. Everytime we make the sign of the Cross, let us remember who we are and whose we are. We are children of the Father, disciples of the Son, and temples of the Holy Spirit.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

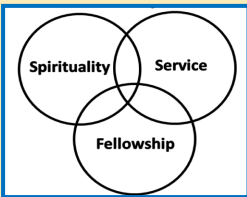

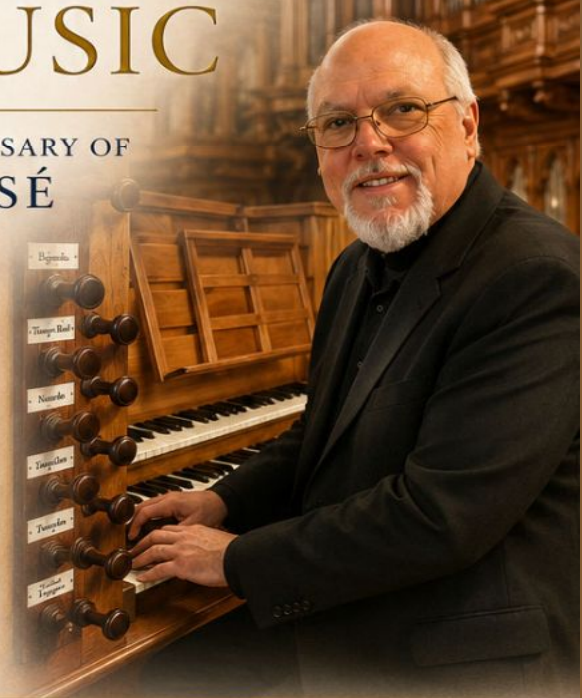

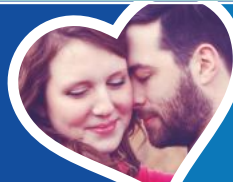
