Dear Brethren,

Disagreements and arguments are a part of being human. We should know that we will not always agree or like each other all the time. That is alright. We don't have to. However,

how we go about our disagreements and conflicts must be reflective of how we profess to be Christian. In our disagreements and arguments, and maybe even if we don't like each other, we must take caution that we do not fall into sin. Too often, it is too easy for us to sin in these areas.

When I was in the Navy, our officers always told us if we had a disagreement with someone, try to handle it at the lowest level possible. If it could not be resolved there, then we would need to take it up through the chain of command. This is a very biblical principle, even for a secular institution, because it works. It also helps to protect the dignity of the two parties in conflict. Learning how to resolve conflicts in a civil manner is not only part of being a Christian, but of being a well-rounded human being as well. In all we do, we must remember to act and speak with charity.

We see this in the readings of the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel according to Saint Matthew gives us an example of how we are to handle our conflicts. First with each other, but then if it cannot be resolved, bring in another brother or two to help resolve it. If they are not willing to listen, bring a brother in to help work out the situation.

It might be worth asking ourselves if we handle conflicts this way or do we resort to something else.

How often do people resort to gossip? Do we seek to slander the reputation of the other person so we can make them look bad? Another question we might want to ask ourselves is this. *Am I holding a grudge and not forgiving?*

Whatever it may be, we need to try talking to that individual first, then go ask a friend if that doesn't work, then to the Church as the last resort. We might be tempted to go to the Church right away, but this is the last resort. I would not be inclined to listen to someone who came to me telling me about the wrong someone had done to them when they did not try to resolve it with that person, and I would not expect the same from any of you either.

Let us think of the person who is being confronted with wrongdoing. If you were in that person's position, do you want everyone to know your business or do you want the person who claims you offended them to come to you and work it out? Pay them the courtesy of going to them first.

This Scripture also talks about winning over your brother. If that happens, then a conversion of heart and mind has taken place and reconciliation has occurred. Conversion of the person who has committed the offense is the most important part. This is the aim of what we want. Conversion helps lead to healing and reconciliation.

Let's all learn to work out our disagreements and conflicts in a Christian manner.

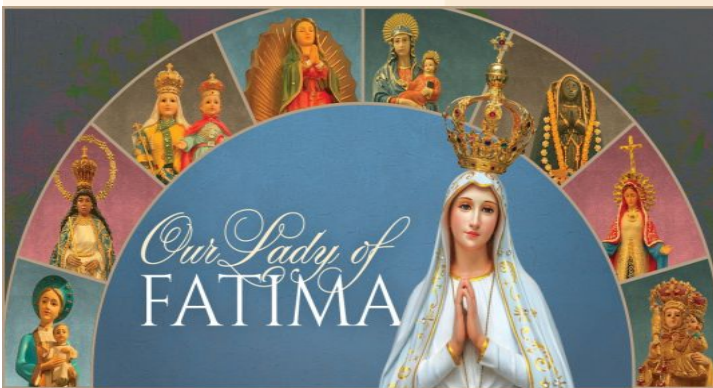

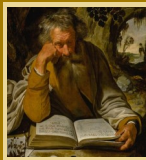

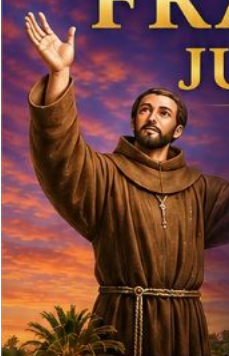

ENCYCLICAL LETTER **MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS** OF HIS HOLINESS POPE LEO XIV ON SAFEGUARDING THE HUMAN PERSON IN THE TIME OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

12. Secondly, building for the common good means accepting the limits and weakness of humanity without considering them an error to be corrected. Today, the human desire for fullness of life is at risk of being misled by deceitful goals, such as the prospect of a technology that promises to free us from all weakness, and models of wellbeing that leave behind entire populations. All too often, we place our hope in unlimited “upgrades,” in forms of progress that exacerbate inequalities, and in immediate solutions incapable of healing people’s wounds. As a result, while some pursue the illusion of unlimited self-assertion, many are deprived of basic necessities. The Church reminds us, with a firm yet humble voice, that true fulfilment is not achieved by eliminating weakness but through harmonious growth. It is found where freedom and responsibility are intertwined with mutual care and true solidarity, and where progress is measured by the dignity of each person and the good of all peoples.

13. Thirdly, building a world in which everyone can flourish requires shared responsibility and courage. No one can single-handedly bear the weight of the challenges the world is facing, just as no one is so weak that they cannot play their part, for “power is made perfect in weakness” (2 Cor 12:9). All are given their own section of the wall: scientists and researchers, entrepreneurs and workers, educators and legislators, civil society, popular movements and faith communities. This is the logic of subsidiarity, which values the cooperation between generations, peoples, disciplines and cultures as the best way for fostering stability, prosperity and peace. We should not be intimidated by tensions or differences because they can become creative forces when guided by shared responsibility.

14. Finally, building for the common good requires an evangelical language. We must avoid humiliating or antagonistic words, opting rather for a clarity that sheds light and a frankness that unlocks new possibilities. We cannot condone naïve enthusiasms, nor fuel unfounded fears. Instead, let us establish standards for discernment — the dignity of the human person, the universal destination of goods, the preferential option for the poor, care for our common home and peace — and let us translate these standards into practices such as responsible planning, the assessment of human and social impact, the inclusion of the most vulnerable, the promotion of digital literacy and guiding research and industry toward justice and peace.

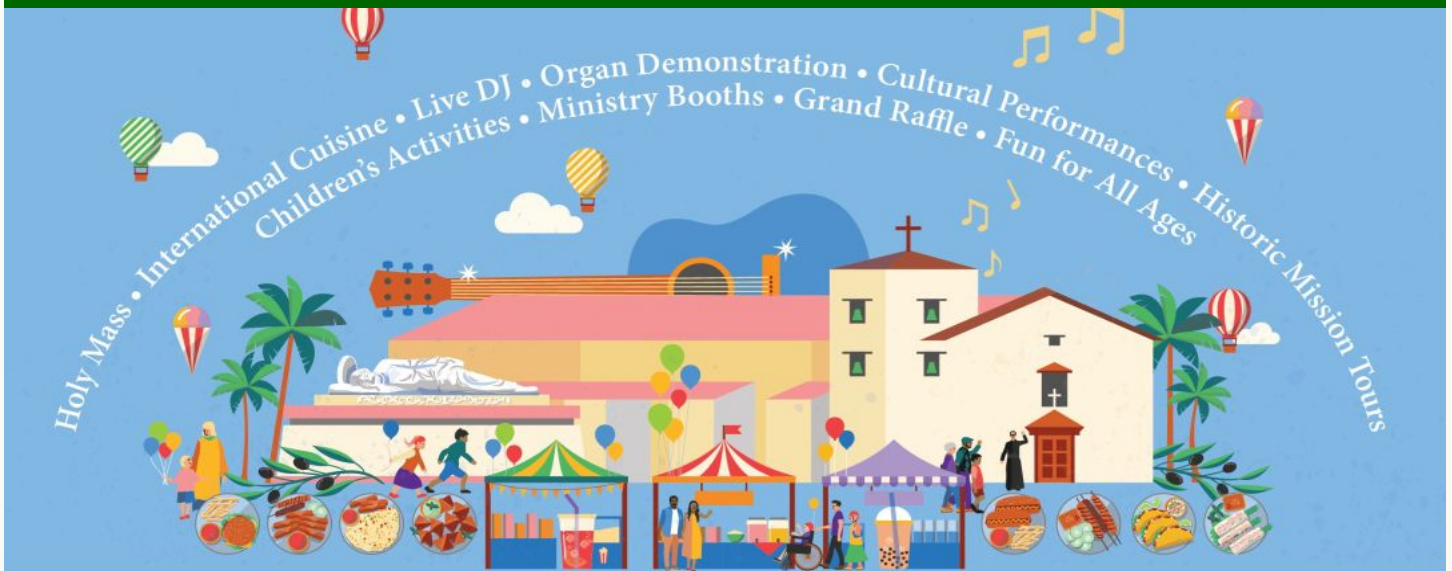

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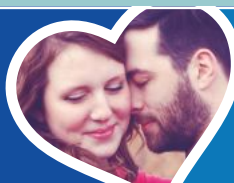
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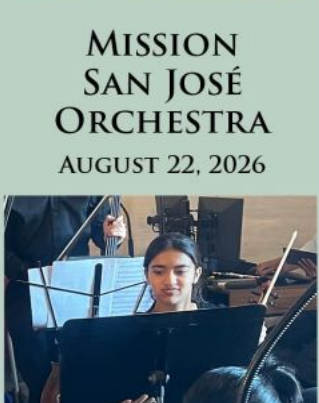
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
